Today we are going to learn to gallop just like a horse.

Galloping is stepping off one foot then sliding with the other foot in a forward direction.
Weight is transferred from the front foot to the back foot with a small lift, before the front foot takes the next step. The stepping foot is always the front foot.

Cut the paper into squares to make 'Make it...' cards. Make cards up to 10 or more.
