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Dear Parents and Caregivers



This year has tested the resilience of everyone and thankfully the number of community transmission of Covid19 has reduced significantly. However, we cannot be complacent until a vaccine becomes available.

Presentation Day

The NSW Department of Education recently updated the Covid19 guidelines for school events like Presentation Day. The guidelines stipulate:

- Schools must comply with the 4 square metre rule for all people participating and will need to invite guests based on the total number of people (this includes staff, students, parents and carers and visitors) who are able to be accommodated under the 4 square metre rule.
- Schools may need to consider holding multiple events across year groups or stage group cohorts in order to comply with the 4 square metre rule.

Presentation Day will be very different this year due to the requirements of social distance in our school hall and the Covered Learning Area. We will be holding four short informal events with only parents of award recipients invited to attend in the morning. Parents will need to sign in from the canteen gate and stay in set seating within a designated area. The schedule is:

Sport awards for Years 3-6 students will be presented informally at school on Friday 27 November 2020 with only Years 3-6 as an audience.

School reports will be sent home on Friday 20 November 2020. Parents wishing to discuss their child's progress can do so by contacting the office and leaving a message for their child's class teacher.

Year 6 Orientation Day, Graduation and Farewell

Year 6 moving into a public high school have their Orientation Day on Tuesday 1 December 2020. This is a consistent statewide date. Parents will need to make arrangement for their child to be at the Orientation Day. Our school does not provide transport.

The Year 6 Graduation will be held in the hall on Wednesday 2nd December 2020 at 8:20am. Only parents of Year 6 students and newly elected school captains and school leaders will be invited to attend. Parents will need to enter from the York Street canteen gates and sign in upon arrival. Designated seats will be provided and cannot be moved.

The Year 6 Farewell will be held at Merrylands Bowling Club on the evening of Wednesday 2nd December. Under the Covid19 plan with the club, no parent will be permitted to enter the club unless they are a member. Instead, a drop off point will be marked just outside the club for student drop off (5:45pm) and pick up (8:00pm).

Enrolment

Last year, the NSW Department of Education published a revised enrolment policy. Each school has a cap on the number of enrolments they can accept. Our cap is 320 students and we have exceeded it. Please be aware that parents who move out of our local area but choose to keep their child in our school may be required to enrol any further brother or sister into their designated local school. Our school advises that if parents do decide to move, please check whether you remain in our school local area or not.

Please advise the office if you intend to move during the school vacation.

Students in Years 1 and 2 visited Longneck Lagoon Environmental Education Centre in Maraylya to explore the environmental centre, create nature maps, engage in dip netting and use microscopes.

2021 Kindy Enrolments

We are now accepting Kindergarten enrolments for 2021. If you have a child born between 1st January and 31st December 2015 you must enrol him/her for Kindergarten next year. If your child is born between 1st January and 31st July 2016 you have the choice to send them to kindergarten next year or wait for them to mature a little more and start them in 2022.

If you have moved and are living out of the MEPS local school intake area you will have to apply as an 'Out of Area Enrolment'. Please see our website to determine if you are still in our local area.
